When Partners for Care first began working in Kenya, we had no idea the impact the organization might have, and we knew we couldn't help everyone. So in the beginning our goal every day was to "change just one life." Eleven years later, PFC has changed the lives of literally thousands of people through our programs and staff on the ground.

Of course, none of this would be possible without the steadfast support of our donors who faithfully pray, give, and share the work of PFC with others. We are blessed that our donors embrace the concept to "do for one what we wish we could do for everyone." The support of our donors (whom we call development partners) has enabled our staff in Kenya to reach over a million people with the life-saving message of HIV/AIDS prevention. Because of the generosity of our donors, 50,000 people have received water backpacks, providing safe water to children in schools and households; over 8,000 have been given bed nets to protect against malaria. Hundreds of people can now read, write, sew, and use computers greatly enhancing their ability to find jobs and feed their families. Mobility carts have been given to hundreds of physically challenged children and adults who no longer have to crawl on the ground. And many have heard the gospel and accepted Christ into their lives.


