1 Overview

Partners for Care (PFC) seeks to spread the gospel in the unreached regions of Marsabit and Kilifi Counties. The PFC staff use a dynamic strategy to spread the word that adapts to each community's specific needs since the staff are locals in these regions. This report explores the innovative ways the PFC staff manage to engage people in evangelism, the frequency of their outreach and the diverse strategies used to preach the gospel.

FREQUENCY 02

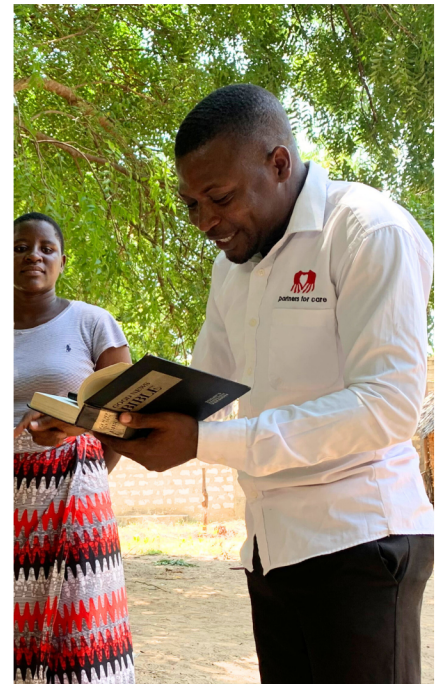
1. Regular Missionary Trips

The PFC staff in Kilifi and Marsabit make regular trips to unreached regions to visit the villages. The PFC Marsabit staff visit the villages every Friday and undertake door-to-door and community outreach.

For the Kilifi staff, they set aside Wednesday and Friday afternoons for evangelism. Every Wednesday they go door-to-door in the villages, and every Friday, they conduct open-air outreach. Gospel music is played during the open-air outreach to attract people to Christ. The team also targets weekly school outreaches through the Christian Union Club and this is prioritized whenever they are granted permission.

2. Local Church Initiatives

The PFC staff in Marsabit organize weekly (Sunday) outreaches in the church to maintain a consistent presence and establish rapport with the community. In Kilifi, PFC staff Karisa Menza is a pastor at “**Overcoming Faith Ministries**” where he ministers every Sunday.

Methods of Preaching the Gospel 03

1. Community events

The PFC staff organize community events such as open air crusades and outreaches to create a sense of community, allow for interaction and spreading of the gospel.

2. Relationship building

The PFC staff have understood the meaning of consistent presence and building personal relationships through mentorship and discipleship. Use of local languages and providing examples using the local context serve as a major boost in spreading the gospel.

3. Community - based Initiatives

The PFC staff do not limit their evangelism to the specified dates. PFC is involved in activities like jigger treatment, mobility cart distribution, water backpack and bed net distribution where spreading the gospel is always part of the conversation. The team in Marsabit has also purposed that whenever people come to fetch water from the water point at the PFC Center of Hope, they get an opportunity to learn more about the gospel before going home. During times of crisis the teams provide food aid which opens doors for sharing the gospel.
