Last December, we set the Partners for Care program goals for 2020. These goals were set before the world experienced the Covid-19 pandemic. Like every country in the world, Kenya was hit with the virus. The PFC staff wanted to continue to serve - to do the best they could to meet their program goals.

We bought bicycles so the staff wouldn't have to ride public transportation, and we sent personal protection equipment (PPE) so staff could continue to serve while staying safe. They treated people infected with jiggers while wearing masks and face shields. They saw patients in the medical clinic and distributed bed nets while wearing PPE. They repurposed the water backpacks to be used as handwashing stations to help stop the spread of the virus.

Our staff have continued to serve and all remained safe. We are grateful for their safety and for your support through this difficult year. Without your support, PFC would not have been able to serve those most in need.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS

In partnership with Mount Kenya University received a prestigious grant, the University Award for Innovative Civic Engagement for distribution of water backpacks and the treatment of jiggers.

Initiated the Hand Wash Campaign to help prevent the spread of the Coronavirus in partnership with the Kenya Red Cross, St. John's Ambulance, Raymond Foundation and other organizations.

Hosted a team from Mobility Worldwide led by Gary Moreau, Columbia Mobility Worldwide.

Partnered with the Kenya Israeli Embassy in the distribution of mobility carts. The Ambassador Mr. Oded Joseph attended the event.

Selected to participate in Action Learning Training by Emerging World sponsored by Maersk.

A student developed a 3D hologram in the Zetech Innovation Hub a partnership with **PFC**.

Signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Zetech University for collaboration in research.

Partnered with Living with Hope to distribute 40 mobility carts and hundreds of mobility devices at Cure International in Kijabe.

Held our first virtual fundraising event, The Virtual Elephant, which was highly successful.




