Stephen graduated with a degree in journalism and plans to write about the struggles of people with disabilities and advocate for them.



2025 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

PFC marked 2025 with strategic milestones that amplified reach and sustainability:

Hosted the 6th Annual Virtual Elephant, raising funds to ship 12 containers of mobility carts in 2026

Our Founder and Kenyan Director attended the 2025 Rotary International Convention, the 2025 Lions International Convention, sharing the WaterSafe backpack's impact, and PFC Staff attended the Africa Lions Conference in Naivasha

Acquired a Villa in Watamu, Kilifi County, enhancing sustainability

Purchased a factory in Utawala, Nairobi, for the production of Mobility Carts and signature INUA "Carry Hope" bags

Launched the Mel West Vision 2 and the Elderly Cannot Wait programs to accelerate aid for vulnerable groups

Inua Branding Hub staff attended the Africa Fashion Sourcing Week, printed Song Bird and Penney Farm calendars, and merchandise for an event in the United Kingdom

The medical staff partnered with KUTOA Initiative to train community outreach workers on trauma counselling and mental health

Marsabit was gifted a projector and screen for their evangelism outreach

The Marsabit staff supported the Muthee and Parkishon communities with water through the installation of storage tanks and WaterSafe backpacks



The Beautiful Story of Loice Chome

Because every story matters



This is what empowerment looks like.

This is what hope sounds like.

This is the beautiful story of Loice Chome.

"In a quiet village in Kilifi, Thalathameli, beneath the comforting shade of an old mango tree, I stitch together not just fabric — but hope, dignity, and a better future for my family.

I am Loice Chome, a devoted mother of eight. I've been told I am, 'one of the most inspiring graduates' of the sewing program introduced through the partnership between the Mazao Family Project and Partners for Care.

For years, life had been unkind to my family when my husband, once the breadwinner, lost his job five years ago.

Since then, the financial struggle has been constant. Feeding a family of ten, paying school fees, and meeting daily needs was an endless uphill climb. Despite the challenges, I carried on with a quiet strength — a belief that one day, things would change.

That change arrived when I joined the Mazao–Partners for Care Sewing School. With determination, I embraced every lesson. **I wasn't just learning to sew; I was learning to rebuild my life.** My talent quickly became visible — as I excelled in my class, showing creativity and a deep desire to uplift my children through my own hands.

Today, my sewing machine sits proudly under the mango tree on my home compound — a humble space that has become the heart of my new business. From this simple outdoor workshop, I create beautiful bags, Ankara outfits, and custom designs that the community loves. **Each item I sell helps me pay my children's school fees, buy food, and meet our family's needs.**

I speak with deep gratitude to Mazao and Partners for Care for the opportunity to learn to sew. Without the training, support, and kindness I received, my story would have looked very different.

I thank God for this opportunity and often say, with emotion, that I never thought I could earn a living through my own hands. This program changed my life, and my children now have a future.

My story is a powerful reminder that transformation does not always begin in grand places — Sometimes, it begins beneath a mango tree, in the hands of a determined mother who refuses to give up.

Because of the Mazao–PFC partnership, I am no longer defined by my struggle. I am defined by resilience, gratitude, and a new confidence that inspires everyone around me.

"My journey began in 2018, when the Partners for Care Kilifi team provided me with my first mobility cart. **This empowered me** to attend high school in Kilifi County. There, I **excelled** and **secured** a spot at Kenyatta University.

In 2022, PFC supported me with a second cart, a cooler, and a minimart business selling chapatis, sodas, and water. **This enabled me to cover my personal expenses and have pocket money while pursuing my dreams.**

During today's joyful celebration, I shared these words: **'When I received one of the carts, it carried a message from Ecclesiastes 3:11: He has made everything beautiful in its time.'**

PFC not only made my life beautiful, but this cart became a reminder that God is making my life beautiful. Despite being abled differently, I am wearing this beautiful gown today!
